Young Professional Leadership Council Service

CURE Childhood Cancer is always looking for outstanding individuals to serve on our Young Professional Leadership Council (YPLC). The YPLC is a group of dynamic young leaders who are committed to the mission of advancing research for better treatments and cures for childhood cancers and supporting patients and their families. Service on the YPLC is an opportunity for leadership development, networking and social interaction with like-minded professionals committed to making a difference in the community in which they live and work. The urgency of our mission dictates that the YPLC must be an active, working council, comprised of individuals willing and eager to roll up their sleeves and make a difference for children fighting cancer.

CURE's YPLC meets monthly, engages in meaningful volunteer activities throughout the year and helps plan and sell an annual fundraiser, Spring Fever. YPLC members can expect a high degree of professionalism, respect and accountability, in addition to the incredible sense of fulfillment from their service. The council is advisory in nature and does not have governance responsibilities. Members serve a term of two years. Requirements for membership include:

- 🎯 **Personal Donation:** Minimum of \$250 personal contribution to CURE each year.
- 🎯 **Fundraising:** Because we all share a passion for advancing research and treatments for children with cancer, fundraising for that purpose is a big part of YPLC service at CURE.
 - All members are expected to participate in the Spring Fever fundraising efforts by soliciting sponsors, patrons, auction donors and/or other support. Specifically, members are expected to procure a minimum of \$2,500 in sponsorships or in-kind support.
- 🎯 **Meetings:** The YPLC meets monthly. Members are expected to attend no fewer than 75% of these meetings – in person, by phone or by video. Additionally, members are expected to:
 - Attend annual YPLC kick-off event
 - Attend one meeting of CURE's Board of Directors
- 🎯 **CURE Events:** Members should attend at least one of CURE's signature events, either as a guest or volunteer:
 - Believe Ball – January 15, 2022
 - Lauren's Run – April 24, 2022
 - A Tribute to Our Quiet Heroes – May 14, 2022
 - Believe Ball – November 12, 2022
- 🎯 **Family Support:** While not a strict requirement, YPLC service will be much more fulfilling if members participate in some of our patient and family support programs, such as serving meals to hospitalized children and family members, volunteering at our holiday party, etc.

OUR HISTORY

Since our establishment in 1975, CURE has focused our efforts on improving the care, quality of life, and outcomes for children with cancer. The founders, parents and a dedicated pediatric oncologist, joined forces to support laboratory research that would translate into immediate care for children with cancer.

Since that time, CURE has raised millions of dollars to fund innovative research at the Aflac Cancer and Blood Disorders Center at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, Emory University School of Medicine and other prominent institutions nationwide. CURE also provides support for families battling childhood cancer aimed at addressing their critical and urgent needs.



OUR ANNUAL BUDGET

CURE's annual budget is \$8 million. 50% of our funds go to support research, 38% to patient and family support, including education, and 12% cover administrative costs and fundraising expenses.

We proudly receive the highest rating from charity watchdog Charity Navigator year over year, indicating CURE outperforms most other charities in America, according to Charity Navigator's CEO.
